ACID SOIL ACTION FUNDING

Acid Soil Action (ASA) has been funded for a further three years. Applications are now available closing 18 August, for funding for projects that enhance the knowledge and skills of farmers to better manage acid soils or develop strategies for managing acid soils that will give economic gain to farmers and the environment.

HMLG has decided to apply for funding to undertake a large scale soil testing program, similar to last year but will not involve the detailed analysis. Cost will be \$20 for 0-10 & 10-20 per test.

This 'Outfox the Fox" is targeting foxes when they are most susceptible. September is the end of the mating season and vixens are actively seeking additional food prior to whelping & the time when the population is at its lowest. March targets juvenile foxes which are dispersing and seeking their own
